ELIGIBLE STUDENTS

- African American, American Indian and Latino women
- United States Citizen or United States Permanent Resident
- Enrolled in ABET accredited engineering program
- Demonstrate financial need
- Rising Junior or Senior

AWARD

\$10,000 one-time payment to be used towards the cost of education, e.g. tuition, room,

books, or any other school related expenses.

REQUIREMENTS

Minimum 3.0/4.0 GPA. The scholar must be enrolled in school full-time and remain in good

academic standing.

PROGRAM SUPPORT

Internship opportunities may be available by applying online directly at the Bechtel website or through the NACME Career Center; media opportunities such as NACME newsletter and

website features will be managed by NACME.
